PINNACLE I & II 8:00-9:00

Deb's daughter, Ola 21, lost her life December 23, 2015 due to an accidental overdose from drugs containing fentanyl. Ola's story is both sad and inspirational. Through Ola's story Deb will discuss the complex path to addiction and how a holistic viewpoint must be taken to understand and work with those who are struggling with addiction. Ola's life and tragic story also illustrates how advocacy work can create change.

Sarah Blyth is the founder of the Vancouver Overdose Society. The VODS is an inspiring example of citizen action in a public health emergency. Through the work of this organization many, many lives have been saved in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside, home to some of the most vulnerable & marginalized people in the Vancouver. The VODS not only provides lifesaving measures to those who overdose but also provides access to health & welfare services, educates others in advocacy, community governance, addresses health & social inequalities; and promotes improving health outcomes through empowerment.
